Quiet/Alcohol-free Accommodation

Section 1: Quiet Accommodation

What is meant by 'Quiet Accommodation'?

Those living within this accommodation will agree to maintain a quiet living environment at all times which means keeping all noise to a minimum in both their room and in the associated kitchen spaces. Any guests invited into the accommodation will comply with the same considerations.

Will the surrounding areas also be 'quiet'?

It is understood that the Residences team cannot enforce these requirements in respect of others using the external spaces outside the flats, nor within adjacent accommodation.

Am I guaranteed a 'quiet flat' if I want one?

Initially this will be trialled on the basis of a limited number of selected flats within specific halls. We cannot guarantee that everyone who wishes to take part will be offered one of the available rooms but we will try to offer as many as possible depending on the level of interest.

What if I do not comply with the 'quiet accommodation' regulations?

Please note, anyone who is offered one of these rooms who subsequently then fails to adhere to the rules will be required to relocate to alternative accommodation which may be in a different hall or location.

Section 2: Alcohol-free Accommodation

What is meant by 'Alcohol-free Accommodation'?

Those living in this accommodation will not bring alcohol into their flat or individual room, nor allow any guests to. In addition it will be expected that students will not allow guests into the accommodation in an intoxicated condition.

Am I guaranteed an 'alcohol-free flat' if I want one?

Initially this will be trialled on the basis of a limited number of selected flats within specific halls. We cannot guarantee that everyone who wishes to take part will be offered one of the available rooms but we will try to offer as many as possible depending on the level of interest.

What if I do not comply with the 'alcohol-free accommodation' regulations?

Please note, anyone who is offered one of these rooms who subsequently then fails to adhere to the rules will be required to relocate to alternative accommodation which may be in a different hall or location.
