Computer Law and Artificial Intelligence module

Computers are increasingly prevalent in modern society and an increasing share of the global economy is driven by information technologies. There is, therefore, a high demand for people with legal expertise to advise on the various issues that can arise through the use, and abuse, of novel technologies, like Artificial Intelligence and machine learning algorithms.

In the **Computer Law & AI module** at **Oxford Brookes**, you will gain an understanding of a variety of issues, such as those relating to the gig economy, social media, and cybercrime. Dealing with these and other issues, you will engage with aspects of data protection, intellectual property, and AI regulation.

The chance to work on cutting-edge issues makes this a compelling area of study, offering opportunities to shape the future of this fast-developing area of law. Graduates with expertise in this area often seek careers in law firms or as in-house counsel at major corporations.

Lawyers with knowledge and experience of Computer Law may also be sought after in government departments and think-tanks, where they can influence legal and ethical standards, contributing to the responsible development of digital devices and information technology.

Future studies and careers

There is the option for you to continue your studies at Oxford Brookes as a postgraduate student. We have LLM Law courses, as well as postgraduate studies in many different subjects such as International Relations, Politics and Business and many more.

As a graduate of Oxford Brookes University you will be eligible for the following:

- 10% alumni discount for continuing studies at Oxford Brookes
- Graduate visa to work in the UK for up to two years after you graduate
- Alumni chapter in Kuala Lumpur

Oxford Brookes graduates have gone on to pursue careers in a range of areas within the law and outside of the law such as in-house lawyers, or working in advertising. Graduates also continue to the Bar Practice Course followed by Chambering (called Pupillage in the UK) and we run an optional training course to help you develop your advocacy skills before you start your Bar training.

Every year we run a Law Fair providing you with the chance to meet local employers. Students have often been given the chance to attend the Oxford University Law Fair

Entry Requirements

You need to pass Year 1 and Year 2 exams, and we will consider the results of any re-sits.

IELTS 6.5 overall with 6.0 in Reading and Writing, and 5.5 in Listening and Speaking or equivalent SPM, I-GCSE, O-level etc.*
